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Welcome and re-cap of project intent and scope

Sonia Lark welcomed the group, acknowledging it had been a while since the initial meeting in November 2019.

The intent of the project is to provide access to third party data which the ATO holds. The data will not be mapped to specific labels in the tax return, it will be displayed only, with no limits on transaction numbers.

The minimum viable product (MVP) will include three data sets:

- Taxable Payments Annual Reports (TPAR) – payee data
- Taxable Government Grants and Payments (TGGP) – payee data
- Business Transactions through Payment Systems (BTTPS)

The data will be available throughout the year, and the intent is to provide data for three prior years.

Key outcomes

The Data Visibility solution is expected to be delivered into production mid-2021.

There was discussion around the following points:

- It is expected that reporting frequency may change in the future - there were concerns that, as two of the reports are currently only annual, there is limited access to data outside of the reporting cycle.
- The feedback loop allows clients to advise when the data displayed is incorrect or doesn't belong to them.
- Only high-match data will be displayed.
- A view of the high-level design was provided.
- DSPs can pull all the available data, then 'slice and dice' it to suit their user experience rather than select what they pull. There were concerns that this could potentially be a large load on systems. It was highlighted that once initial data was pulled, DSPs could then select a date after which to poll for additional data.
- Future data sets may include:
 - AUSTRAC
 - STP data, and
 - MAAS and MATS data
