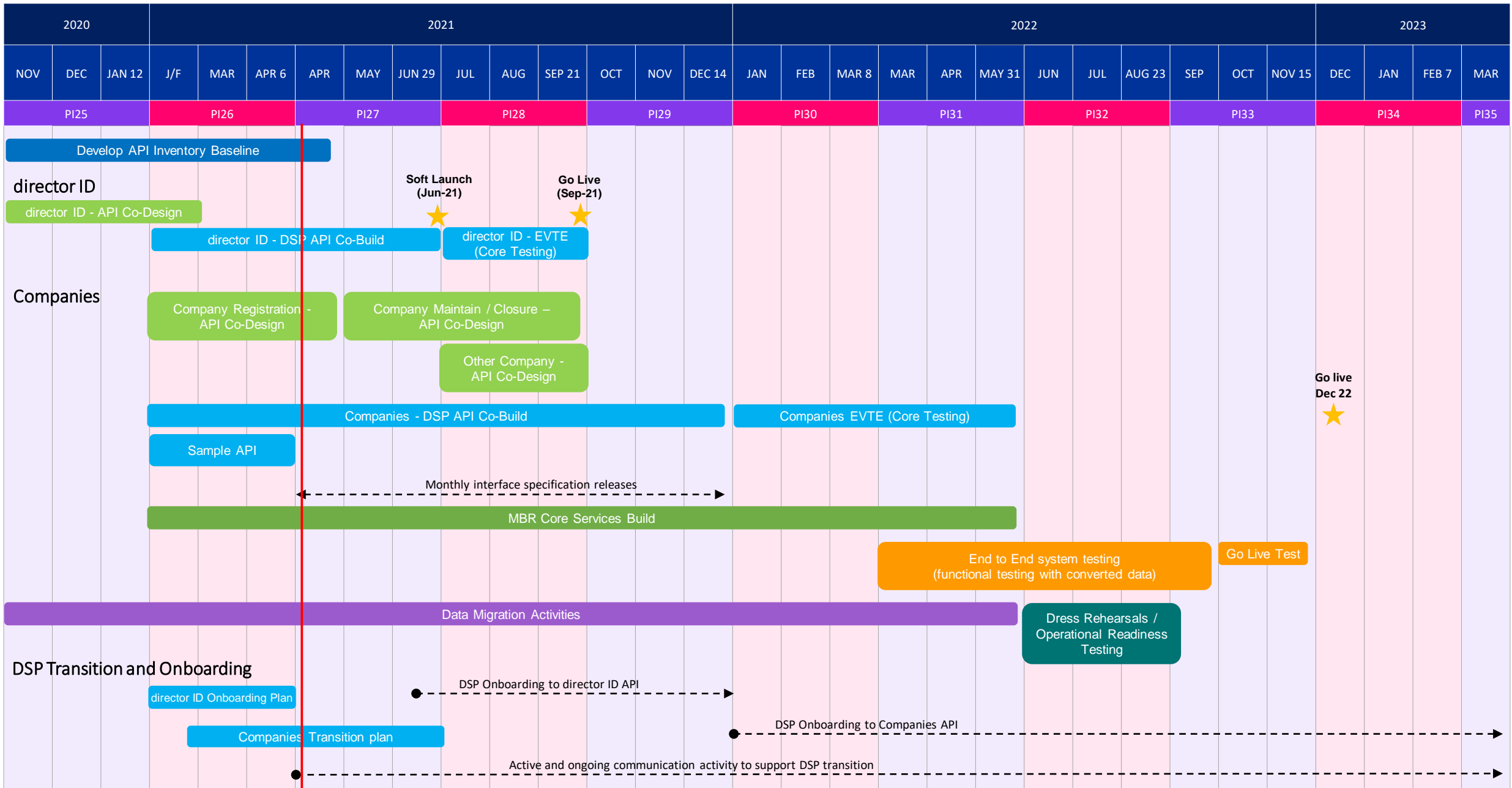

# Problem statement and user stories

Every person who is or intends to be a director needs to apply for a director ID themselves using myGovID

As an agent or company secretary I want to...	Identify who needs a director ID	Inform them they need a director ID	Help them get a director ID	Know if they have or haven't applied for a director ID	Store a valid director ID that belongs to the director in my software

# Bulk RA71 idea

There are multiple sources of updates to companies register.

Data held in agent's software can get out of sync with companies register.

The existing RA71 request enables agents to compare data held in software with the companies register:

- there is a limit of 100 companies for each request
- only returns data for companies that the agent is registered for (uses corporate key).

A company can only have one registered agent in ASIC system.

A bulk RA71 request would make it easier for agents to verify who the directors of a company are at the point in time when the agent is ready to issue an email to encourage directors to apply.

The service could return the same or less data i.e. current officers x company would suffice.

It was noted that any changes to the existing ASIC systems is unlikely to be feasible.

## Next step

Tammy to talk with ASIC about the feasibility of a bulk RA71.



# Unique link idea

Use software to send email to director with unique link/application ID

Director clicks link – uses myGovID to log in to retail service and apply

If successful, director ID is displayed on screen

Use software to call MBR to return result for the application ID/reference no.

Number returned is stored in software against person's record

Unique link could be generated by software or MBR could provide a list of numbers for agent to use to provide the connection back to the agent.

MyGovID prefills name, DOB.

MBR data on director ID:

- has this person got a director ID?
- if yes, what is it?

? MBR authorisation model is not in place yet. How would MBR know agent is an agent of the company?

There are existing agent agreements in place between the company and the agent. ASIC uses these arrangements and the corporate key to authenticate service requests now.

What if user enters the application ID/reference number in their application?  
This could be done fairly easily.

We have user tested a consent model for sharing director ID – hard to explain but people tended to tick.

# Closing comments

## Context

Agents are key point of leverage for success of MBR program including onboarding directors.

One agent looking after 250 companies can reach 500-600 directors.

Agents will need to be able to act for company for Tranche 2. Need to resolve legal framework for agents acting on behalf of companies now.

## Next steps

Tammy Gardner to progress work within MBR program to clarify/confirm feasibility of options generated from a legal, system and DCIS perspective:

- bulk RA71 (with ASIC)
- double blind exchange constraint
- unique link with application ID/reference number
- call to MBR – has person applied for a director ID and if so, what was the result?

Report back to DWG on 13 April 2021.

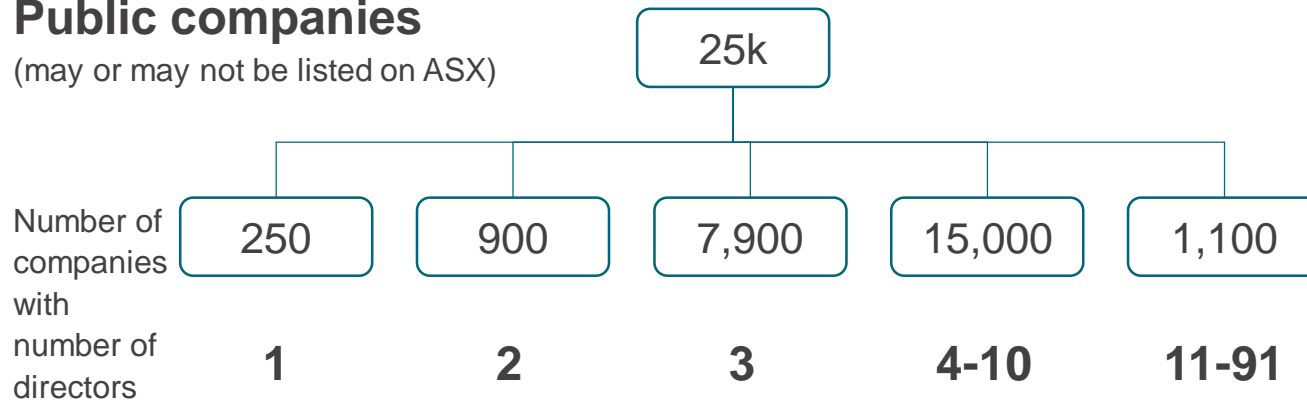
Date	Question	Status/response
5 Mar	What is the spread of companies by number of directors? What proportion of companies are closely held?	See Appendix 2 for readily available data.
5 Mar	TDIF is like the UK exchange model. Will people need to rush out and get a digital ID from each provider?	DTA is aware of the situation. ABSIA has asked DTA to discuss with the ATO.
5 Mar	Will agents be able to maintain details on behalf of the director? Messaging for director ID includes “maintain your details and tell ASIC”. Should be implementing “tell us once” and enabling people to appoint an agent when they apply for their director ID.	Currently working through the legal framework. Design timeline to be tabled at next BAG meeting – includes intermediary experience and individual registry record.
5 Mar	If an intending director’s ID is cancelled because they have not been appointed as a director within 12 months, can register use/display status as inactive rather than cancelled?	Design team is looking at including reason codes for cancelled status.
5 Mar	Is there an opportunity for an intending director to get a director ID, get appointed as a director and then resign a few days later so they can keep their director ID?	Yes. When the person is appointed as a company director the 12 month rule ceases to apply and the person will keep their director ID forever. Note: Having a director ID only indicates the person has established their identity with the registrar.
5 Mar	If a director doesn’t get a director ID how would an agent know if the person was using a fictitious identity? How will fictitious directors be removed when the existing register is transitioned to the new platform?	Tranche 2 Design work is in progress on data migration and associating directors with companies.
17 Mar	If the registrar refuses to give someone a director ID, what’s the process after that?	Support will be available for people who do not successfully complete an application. If a person is not satisfied with the Registrar’s decision, they can request a review of the decision.

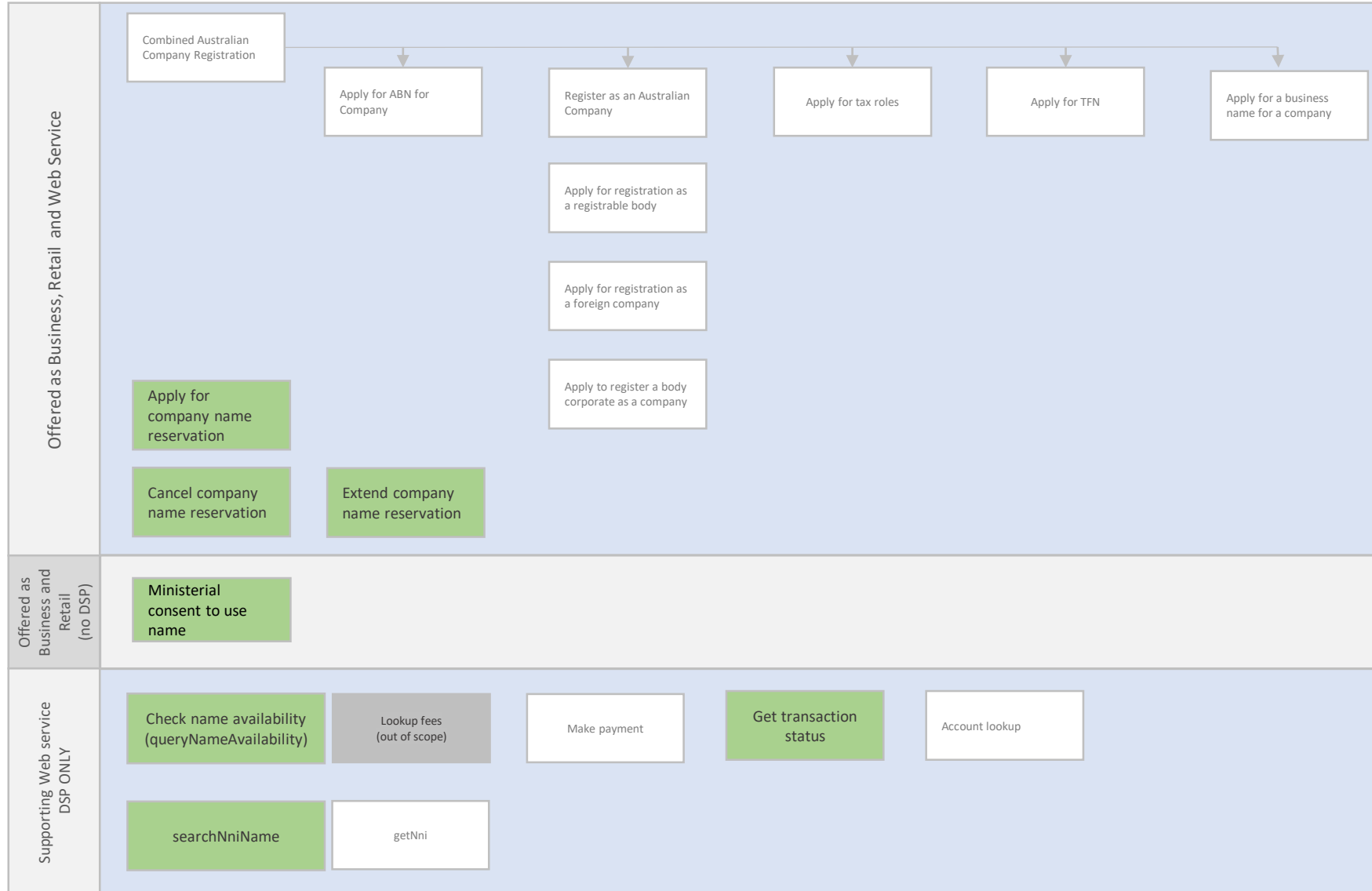

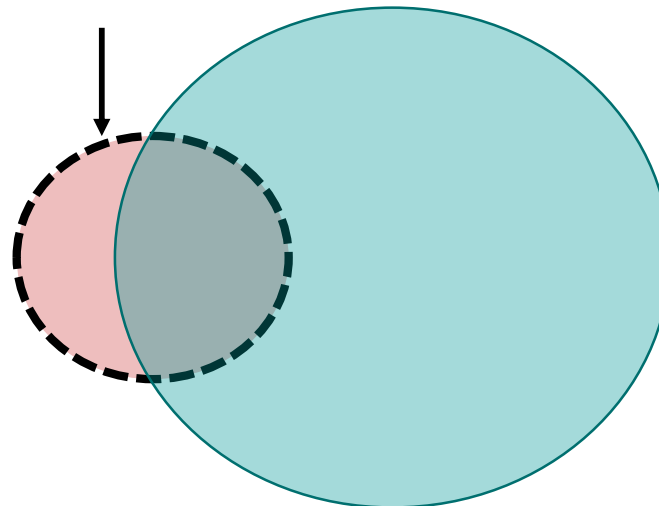

# Data Quality: Cleansing and Harmonisation

- We are bringing together two data sets (ASIC and ABR), and making them into one.
- We will need to resolve data quality issues along the way.
- We will be cleansing and harmonising data during migration.



## Data Cleansing

- Where there is no overlap, we may still cleanse the data
  - This type of cleansing is not all necessary for data migration to occur

## Data Harmonisation

- Where the data overlaps it requires harmonisation
  - ASIC and ABR may have different values
  - The new MBR platform requires only one value
  - To migrate the data we have to change the data.

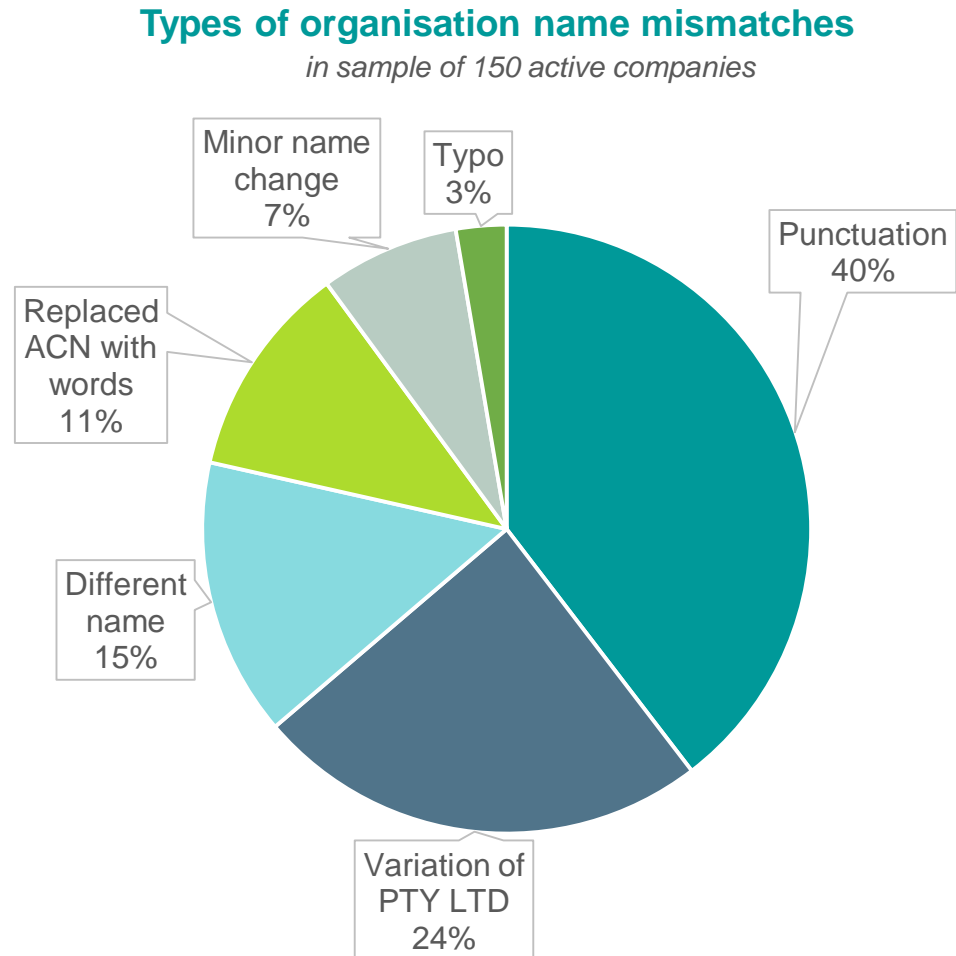
Only a small proportion of the data requires harmonisation but it is the key registry data:

- Company names
- Associated people
- Addresses

# Example: organisation name mismatches

An example of a data harmonisation issue is mismatches between organisation names.

Initial analysis found over 6000 companies with organisation names that mismatch between ASIC and ABR registers.

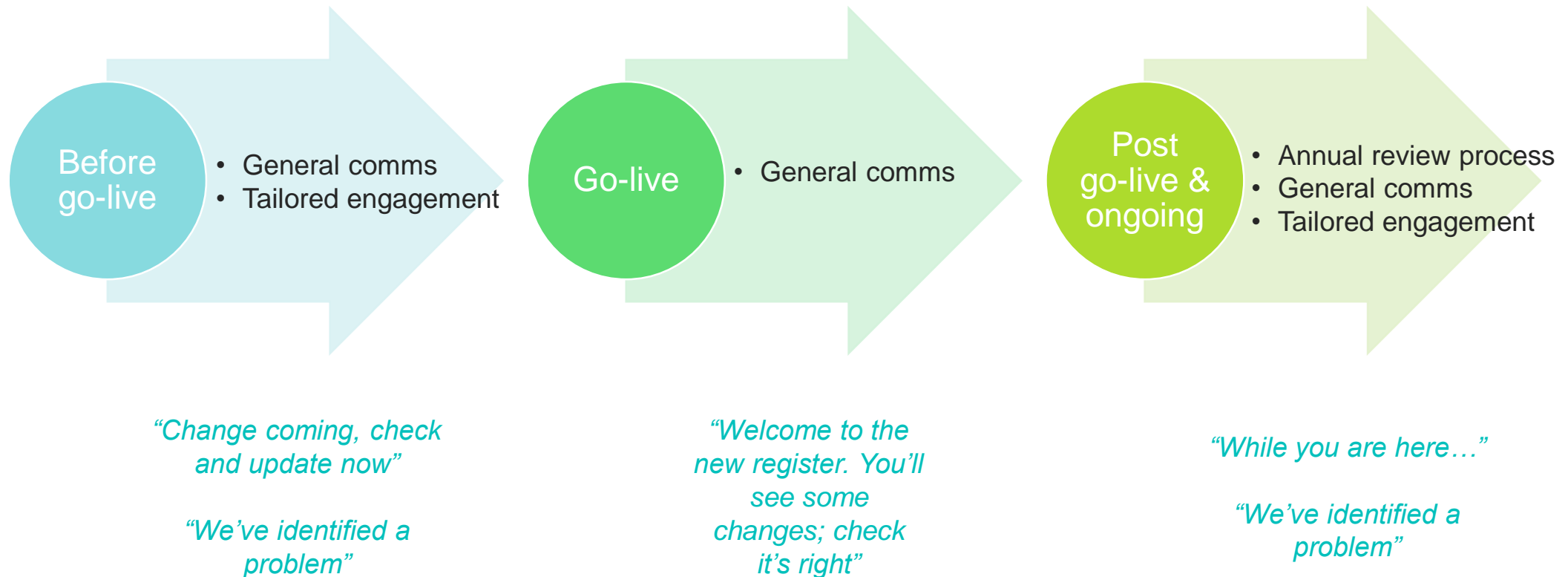

# Involving the community in harmonisation

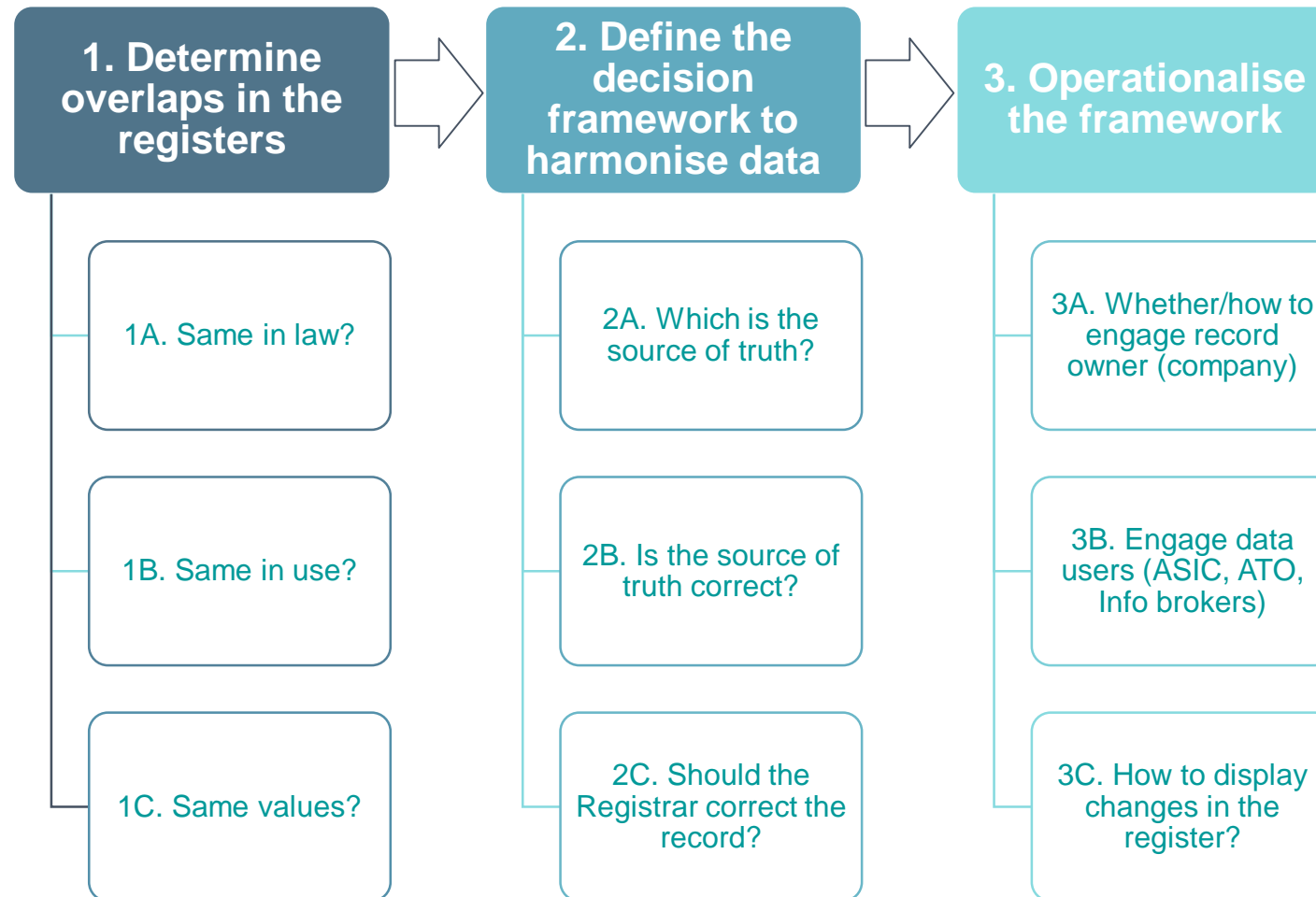
Involving the community enables us to improve the data quality and avoid unnecessary legal complexity.

There are opportunities to engage with clients in different ways and stages prior to go-live (e.g. client contact or correspondence to notify/ verify details) and post go-live by leveraging the natural processes of the Register (e.g. annual fee process) to optimise the data.



# Data harmonisation decision framework

The diagram below explores the high level decision framework for MBR data harmonisation. The detailed legal considerations are complex and require further consultation.



# Appendix: Correcting records

The Registrar has the power through the data standards to correct information.

The Registrar may choose to correct data where the preferred source does not give the best outcome.

# Search Experience Along the MBR Journey

## Overview

The delivery of the MBR program is divided into different releases:

- Machinery of Government changes
- Director Identification Number
- ASIC Companies and their ABNs
- Business Names and the rest of the ABR
- ASIC Professional and Historical Registers

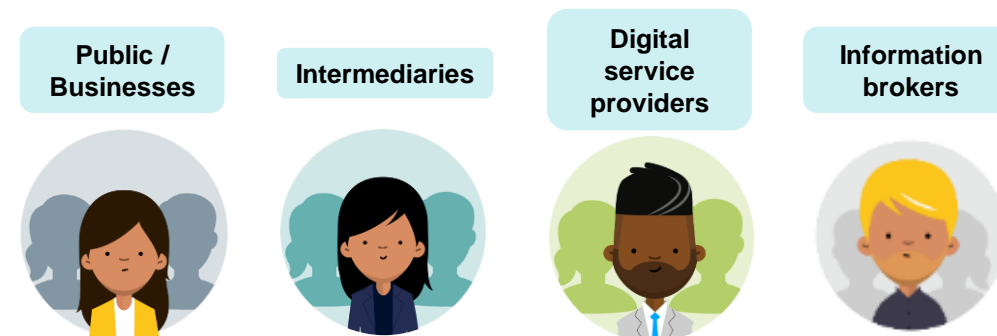
This means from the search perspective, not all the registry data are going to be migrated and made available on the MBR platform until the full program is completed.

This was discussed at the MBR Program Board. Whilst it was recognised there is going to be trade-offs between delivery and user experience for a very large program like MBR, the Board noted we need to manage user experience and expectation carefully.

## Problem Statement

With registry data on different platforms as we implement the full program, search experience for different user groups can be challenging with different websites and APIs from the various underlying platforms.

How are we going to help the different user groups navigate the different websites and services along the MBR journey?



# Search Experience - Websites

- List of registers is not exhaustive
- Public search for Director ID is to be determined
- Reference to MoneySmart is only on the search aspect

## Scenario

As a new sole trader, Tracey isn't ready to invest in software.

As her business grows, she finds she needs to search for:

- Companies/sole traders (to confirm/understand who her clients are and to ensure she wants to go into business with them)
- Directors (to get to know potential clients before commencing work)
- Financial advisors (to advise on investment and superannuation)



BUSINESSES & OTHER ENTITIES

## Director ID >

No change in search experience:

- Search for businesses (incl. companies, partnerships and sole traders) via ABN Lookup and ASIC Connect
- Person search (ASIC) via paper only
- Business Name register search via ASIC Connect
- Professional and historical registers search and check name availability via ASIC Connect
- Financial advisor search via MoneySmart

## Companies >

New search experience:

- Search for companies and directors (director name only) from the Australian Business Registry Services (ABRS) website.
- Check name availability from ABRS (via API to ASIC backend)

No change in experience:

- Search for sole traders and partnerships in ABN Lookup
- Business Name register search via ASIC Connect
- Professional and historical registers search via ASIC Connect
- Financial advisor search via MoneySmart

## Business Names + ABR >

New Search experience:

- Search for companies, sole traders, partnerships and directors in ABR
- Business Name register search in ABR
- Check name availability mastered in ABR

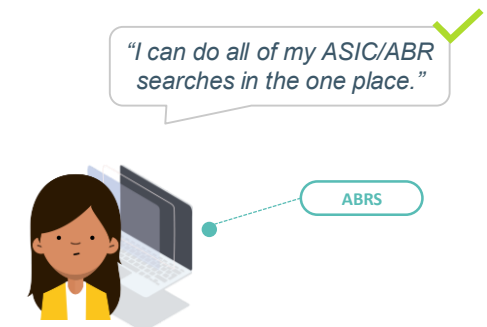
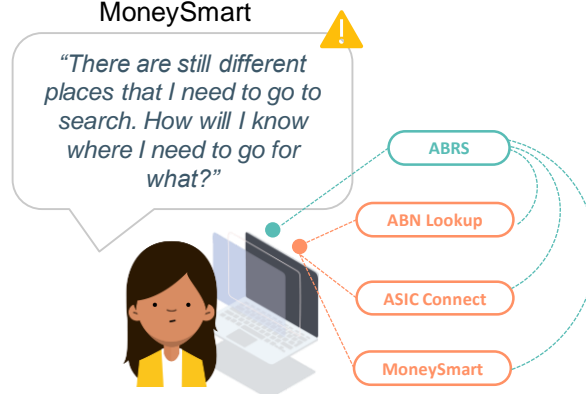
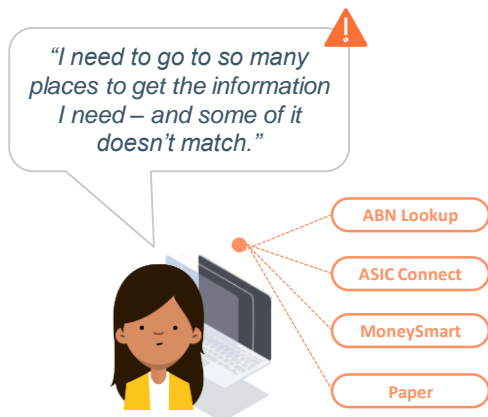

- Check name availability in ABR



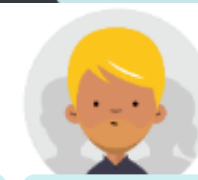
