Agenda item 1 – Welcome and administration

- The chair welcomed attendees and acknowledged new member Tranzsoft.
- Previous meeting minutes accepted.
- Action items to be addressed in agenda (refer to action items summary on page 4-5).

Agenda item 2 – Peppol Authority updates

Accreditation progress

- Tranzsoft was welcomed who has recently become accredited in New Zealand.
- Australia has 27 accredited service providers and New Zealand now has 23.

A-NZ extension / release update

- Payment Means Guidance Note
 - Guidance Note will be finalised soon.
 - A final confirmation is required about PayID with NPPA regarding how to specify the type of PayID (e.g. phone nbr, email, ABN/ACN)
 - No changes will be made regarding the URI/URL guidance.

PINT Proof-of-concept (PoC)

- The PINT PoC has been approved and is currently with OpenPeppol for consideration.
- The team has prepared a draft A-NZ specialisation based on the current specifications. This
 has included feedback received. Once the paper has been completed it will be circulated for
 consultation.

Reporting

- May figures provided to the forum prior to the meeting. Currently finalising June.
- Australia have approx. 5,000 end users
- New Zealand have approx. 2,000 end users

Agenda item 3 – Service Provider updates

End users transferring between SPs

- As the number of accredited providers grows the forum will need to consider the implications of end users wanting to swap or use multiple providers
- This will likely create a lag time between the removal and re-addition onto the Peppol Network
- The OpenPeppol Agreements Revision Task Force (ARTF) has placed this on the backlog and will take some time to be addressed.
- Australia and New Zealand could address this in the interim through a guidance note.

Organisational routing

- New Zealand has adopted Organisational Part Numbers (OPN) that are associated with an NZBN so can be used to provide routing within an organisation. It is acknowledged that the ABN does not have this functionality.
- There is no single way to address organisational routing in Australia businesses should make their own commercial decisions based on advice on options from service providers.

New Peppol Agreements

- The review of over 700 comments received during consultation has almost been completed.
- Beginning to work to implement some of the required updates that we are responsible for.
- Work ongoing over the European summer to address End User Reporting headed up by Simon Foster.
- Unsure of what the backlog of work will entail it is extensive. Agreements, Policies and Procedures CMB (APPCMB) has responsibility.

Peppol Community Updates

- This will become a standing agenda item so Service Providers can have direct information from the variety of committees
- Craig Smith and Simon Foster spoke about the APPCMB
 - Will meet for the first time late this year
 - First task will be to consider the 'backlog' items not able to be completed in the Agreements, Internal Regulations, and Operational Procedures development process
 - Will have a rotating chair through the 4 Peppol Authority representatives and 4 Service Provider representatives
- Post-Award Community CMB (PoACMB) has met once and primarily spoke about PINT

- Also high on the agenda is to consider mandating the support for invoice responses
 - Very early days of consideration

Agenda item 5 – Adoption progress updates

Australia

Larissa introduced herself as Perry's replacement

Government:

- 32 Commonwealth agencies are now enabled; by the end of August, the 80% target of agencies readiness to receive by volume will be achieved.
- State: NSW has mandate by 1 Jan 2022; SA & WA progressing procurement aiming for Sept/Oct 2021;
 VIC is progressing a pilot; Commitment to e-invoicing in the Qld Budget papers
- We are aware that supplier onboarding is an issue and we will be looking at a suite of measures to address it.
- Work is underway for the first refresh of the Peppol Panel, we expect to publish the RFT on AusTender in early August.

Business:

- o Small business content will be launched in late July/early August on business.gov.au
- An expression of interest to participate in supply chain pilots will be issued to the Service Provider
 Forum as well to pilot with Corner 1 & 4 solutions and specific industries.
- The two large business forums, the Champions Adoption Network and Community of Operational Leaders, are fully operational.

New Zealand

- e-invoicing targets have been set for the Central Government including being enabled by 31/03/2022.
- Plans are underway to provide assistance to Government with e-invoicing information packs, seminars, webinars and direct engagement.
- A Service Provider Open Syndicated Agreement for all Government to use is now in place.
- The e-invoicing Adoption Leaders Group has now had 3 meetings.
