## Agenda item 1 – Welcome

Sonya opened the meeting and welcomed the group.

An overview of the working groups sessions held last week was provided:

**ASLRPT changes focus group**

The group discussed the 2023 version of the ASLRPT and ITCRPT services including the Flexible lodgment indicator returned in the response, as well as reduction of the IT Lodgement status reducing from 8 fields to 4. Updated details and guidance will be included in the TPCMR Business Implementation Guide (BIG).

**Changes to the IDS working group**

While law has still not passed for the remaining measures in relation to the International Dealings Schedule (IDS), a walkthrough of the new Message Structure Table (MST) showed changes to existing MST structure, updates to labels, business definitions, business guidance and full enumeration to support the new headings and tuples. The Bill containing this measure may be scheduled for debate in the Senate towards the end of February.

## **MTAS working group**

The group was taken through the new validation rules to support the DISTBENTRT service being integrated to the remaining NITR services in the February EVTE release over the weekend. Business has prepared a document showing draft mapping of the Statement of Distribution (SoD) to the Trust Income Schedule (TIS) labels to the ITR and NITR return. A webinar on the upcoming Modernisation of Trust Administration Systems (MTAS) changes has been scheduled for Thursday 21 March 2024.

## Agenda item 5 – Update on the Legislation for Changes to IDS

As advised to the Changes to International Dealings Schedule (IDS) working group on 5 February, a Senate Committee was considering the thin capitalisation legislation. The Committee has now recommended that the legislation be passed by the Senate. The legislation was listed in Senate business but did not proceed to debate.

The next Senate sitting is likely to be on 26 February 2024. We anticipate the legislation being debated that week. If it does not pass, we will come back to the IDS working group to discuss mitigation as needed.

## Agenda item 6 – Delivery update

Artefacts for the February EVTE release were published on 8 February with the code release on 10 February. This was a large release that included the rollover for the NITR services and an update to FITR which moved to the 2024 schema. The TPCMR MST was updated to address issues with the list of valid statuses returned.

The March EVTE release will occur in early March and will include:

- removal of the small business boost measure labels
- addition of the small business energy boost labels
- updates to income details schedule including removal of duplicate labels and redundant validation rules.

The April EVTE release will see:

- the implementation of new rules and warnings for the R&D schedule
- updates to LDG.list to include the new SAITE role and new activity statement form type
- updates to the outcome of assessment (ASMT) service
- updates to the ITRPRFL service to support MTAS nudge messaging
- updates to occupation codes.

The updated Delivery roadmap will be published shortly.

The group discussed the current deprecation date for the AS.2009 service and would like consideration to be given to extend the date as the AS.2023 service is still undergoing technical changes and investigations. The group was advised these conversations are ongoing and an update will be provided as soon as possible.

## Agenda item 7 – Platform update

All systems are working as expected. Stuck messages experienced last week are being replayed.

## Agenda item 8 – Agent online environment update

There was some degradation to SBR1 and Access Manager, after a reboot and node reset, these issues were resolved.
