Agenda item 1 - Welcome

The chair opened the meeting and welcomed the group.

A reminder that the MTAS phase 2 EOI process is now open, the working group is expected to run for 2 years, with the first meeting anticipated in August 2025.

In addition, co-design opportunities relating to ATO rules as code will be highlighted in this week's DSP newsletter. The ATO is partnering with the Department of Finance to use their sandpit to test our rules as code and deliver a proof of concept – and DSPs are invited to take part.

Agenda item 2 - Action item updates

There is 1 open <u>action item</u> - Business Industry Codes (BIC) - there are no further updates to provide on the BIC code action item. It will remain on pause until Tax Time so we can see if the updates have improved the experience.



Agenda item 3 – Tax time related documentation

All ATO forms and instructions are now available on the ATO website, as a result, there will be no further publishing of 2025 tax time forms and instructions to the DSP Hub.

Agenda item 4 - Update on general matters and Tax time delivery

From 20 June, the Tax Time 2025 release will be deployed and practitioner lodgment service (PLS) products of DSPs who have met the requirements will be whitelisted in production.

Tax Time 2025 PLS additional information FAQs has been updated with the details of 2 new bugs.

Agenda item 5 - Delivery update

July EVTE release (Publication for 17th July):

- Non-Individual Income Tax Return (NITR) 2025 Package:
 - IDS: Removed Alias (IDS612) as no longer required and was replaced as a header in the MST. Updated Technical Business Rule to align with code (documentation only change).
 - o Various bug fixes for PTR2025, FITR2025, TRT2025, TRTAMI2025
 - PTR: PTR431002 returning 'Fault from agency' error
 - FITR: Some cross form validations return wrong document identifier. W00002 returning wrong rule identifier
 - TRT: 5 validation rules were showing wrong date format
 - TRTAMI: Some cross form validations do not contain required labels and values in error messages
- Lodgment (LDG) Package:
 - LDG Get 2019: Updated to include amended field codes applicable for the 2024-2025 financial year in response message structure table

Bug fixes will be added to Tax Time 2025 PLS additional information FAQs.

Agenda item 6 - Platform update

Disaster recovery testing for SBR1, SBR2 and BDE platforms was completed at the end of May with no issues identified. The process for certification of testing is in its final stages with BCM.

The June Integrated Release was successfully deployed on the weekend and testing was signed off successfully. Monitoring of systems will be a key focus heading into tax time.
